We provide a compassionate, non-judgmental and self empowering approach to care for all people using our services. Upon your request your care will be initiated within 45 minutes of arrival to the emergency department at Orillia Soldiers' Memorial Hospital.

Dedicated health-care professionals are available to provide and advocate for your care.

Seek medical treatment from the SADVTC if...

- You're under 12 and you experienced sexual assault or physical abuse at any time in the past (no time frame limitations)
- You're 12 or older and a sexual assault took place in the last 12 days
- You're 16 or older and a domestic/ intimate partner assault/violence/ abuse took place in the last 4-5 days or your injuries are still present/ongoing

What else should I know?

You are not alone. Victims don't tell because they may feel ashamed, scared or they think that no one can help...**We can help!**

Sexual Assault

Sexual assault is any form of unwanted sexual activity including fondling, touching and/or penetration without consent.

Consent is a voluntary agreement between two adults to engage in sexual activity.

Someone who is under the influence of a medication, drugs and/or alcohol is considered impaired and **can not** give consent.

Any individual can be sexually assaulted regardless of gender identity. It is a serious crime whether committed by a stranger, friend, family member or partner.

75% of all sexual assaults are committed by someone the victim knows and trusts

Domestic Violence

Domestic Violence (also referred to as Intimate Partner Violence) is a crime. It results from an imbalance of power and control over one's partner.

This type of abuse can come in many forms: physical, psychological, emotional, sexual, financial, material, spiritual, or verbal threats.

55% of police reported domestic violence incidents are committed by a dating partner.

Physical assault (77%) is the most common offence experienced by victims/survivors of police-reported violence; followed by uttering threats and criminal harassment.

What to do? We can help...

Care is provided in a secure treatment room to protect our clients' privacy and safety; by a team of specially trained dedicated staff available 24/7.

Services are available to both Adolescent / Adult (12 years and over) and Paediatric (under 12 years) age groups.

To access this care, go to the Emergency Department at OSMH and ask for the SADV nurse on-call.

Medical Care Options

Services include, but are not limited to:

- Crisis support
- Assessment and documentation of injuries/ assault history
- Sexual Assault Evidence Kit and/or photography
- Testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections
- Emergency contraceptive options
- Testing for drugs that may have been used to commit the assault
- Risk assessment and safety planning
- Referral to community resources

Police Involvement

If you choose to involve the police: We will carefully collect and document the necessary evidence for release and analysis.

- Referral to and coordination with community services & resources
