Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities (AODA)



Purpose of the Act

- To improve opportunities for persons with disabilities and help identify, remove and prevent barriers to their full participation in life in the Province
- Applies only to the Ontario Public Service and the broader public sector
- Required public accessibility plans be developed

- The purpose of the AODA is to achieve accessibility for Ontarians by January 1, 2025
- The AODA outlines the requirement for the development of standards in the following areas:
 - Customer service
 - Transportation
 - Information and communications
 - Employment
 - Design of public spaces

- Accessible entrances
- Accessible Parking
- Accessible Elevators



Tools for healthcare providers

- Hearing Impaired Stickers
- Sight –Impaired stickers



- Should be on all interdepartmental requisitions to ensure staff are aware that the patient is hearing impaired
- Can also obtain signage for above the bed <u>IF</u> the patient consents
