PRISM is an innovative mentoring program designed specifically for the 2sLBGTQIA+ community. In the PRISM program, a 2sLBGTQIA+ youth will be matched with a Mentor from the same community. The goal is to provide role models for all 2sLBGTQIA+ youth to safely discuss identity and foster pride, self-confidence, and acceptance.

As with all of our programs Mentors and Mentees will be matched based on common interests and compatibility, and the match will operate just as a traditional, community-based match with support from our trained clinical staff.
